

LAWS OF NEW YORK, 2000

CHAPTER 438

AN ACT to amend chapter 43 of the laws of 1994 relating to establishing a public library district in the town of Esopus, Ulster county, in relation to the time of commencement of the terms of office of the trustees of such district

Became a law September 20, 2000, with the approval of the Governor.
Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 3 of chapter 43 of the laws of 1994 relating to establishing a public library district in the town of Esopus, Ulster county, is amended to read as follows:

§ 3. Organization and structure. The Town of Esopus public library district shall be managed, operated and controlled by a board of trustees consisting of nine members. These trustees shall at the first regular meeting of the board determine by lot the year in which each of their terms of office expire, and the terms shall expire as follows: After one year - two trustees; after two years - two trustees; after three years - one trustee; after four years - two trustees; after five years - two trustees. As vacancies occur trustees shall be elected at the annual election herein provided for to serve for [~~five~~] three year terms by the voters of the library district hereby created, said terms to commence on the first day of [~~September~~] June next following the election. Only qualified voters of the district shall be eligible for election to the board of trustees. The board of trustees at its first meeting each year shall elect or appoint a president and vice-president who shall be members of the board and a clerk, treasurer and such other officers as they deem necessary. If the board so determines, the offices of clerk and treasurer may be held by individuals who are not members of the board of trustees, and in that event, these officers may, if the board so determines, receive compensation as fixed by resolution of the board.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
