

LAWS OF NEW YORK, 2007

CHAPTER 354

AN ACT to amend chapter 370 of the laws of 2001 relating to creating the Clifton Park-Halfmoon library district in Saratoga county, in relation to the date of the annual election of such district

Became a law July 18, 2007, with the approval of the Governor.
Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of chapter 370 of the laws of 2001 relating to creating the Clifton Park-Halfmoon library district in Saratoga county is amended to read as follows:

§ 7. Annual election. In the event that the Clifton Park-Halfmoon public library district is created, its annual election shall be held each year [~~on the second Thursday following Labor Day~~] in September as determined by the board of trustees of such district. The board of trustees of the Clifton Park-Halfmoon public library district shall prepare the ballots for such elections and the polls shall remain open for the receipt thereof at all elections from 8:30 a.m. until 8:30 p.m., and such additional consecutive hours prior thereto as the board of trustees may have determined and specified in the notice thereof. In the event that the board of trustees of the Clifton Park-Halfmoon public library district determines there is a need to seek taxpayer approval for capital expenditures for the expansion of existing library facilities or for the construction of new library facilities, such approval shall be a separate ballot item to be approved by all qualified voters at an annual election. The board of trustees of the Clifton Park-Halfmoon public library district may, to the extent authorized by law, authorize the use of absentee ballots for the annual election.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
