CHAPTER 642

AN ACT to authorize the town of Greenburgh, Westchester county, to establish a public library for that portion of the town located outside of the incorporated villages of Tarrytown, Irvington, Dobbs Ferry, Hastings-on-Hudson, Ardsley and Elmsford

Became a law April 18, 1960, with the approval of the Governor. Passed, by a majority vote, three-fifths being present

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Greenburgh, town, public library.

Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or local law to the contrary, the town of Greenburgh, Westchester county, is hereby authorized, by action of a majority vote of the town board of the town of Greenburgh, to establish a public library with or without branches for that portion of the aforesaid town which is outside of the limits of the incorporated villages of Tarrytown, Irvington, Dobbs Ferry, Hastings-on-Hudson, Ardsley and Elmsford, and such town is hereby authorized to raise money by tax, to equip and maintain such library and to provide a building or rooms for its use. Such tax shall be a charge upon the taxable property of that portion of the town of Greenburgh which is outside of the limits of the incorporated villages of Tarrytown, Irvington, Dobbs Ferry, Hasting-on-Hudson, Ardsley and Elmsford. Such town is hereby authorized to acquire real or personal property for the purposes of such library by gift, grant, devise, bequest or condemnation, and is further authorized to take, buy, lease, sell, hold and transfer real or personal property for the purposes of such library. Except as otherwise provided by this act, the provisions of the education law relating to public libraries shall be applicable to a public library established in pursuance of this act.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
